Back then, we had no clue about the direction our commitment would take in the years to come.

After the first year, we were pleased that we could collect enough funds from our friends and families to support a small health station in a slum area in Dhaka, Bangladesh. I believe it was no more than two or three thousand euros that we had to make do with back then, even though we could certainly have put much more to good use.

Now, 20 years later, we look back on a very turbulent and industrious period during which our organization has grown significantly and lifted countless young people out of poverty through empowerment, thanks to your donations or your project support. Despite all the global challenges of the past years, SONNE has once again succeeded in keeping all its ongoing projects alive and initiating new ones in 2022. For this annual report, as always, we have summarized our activities in the various partner countries, which, given their diversity, now presents a special challenge. Added to the usual structure of the annual report is a graphical representation of the key milestones of the first 20 years of our organization, which you will find in the middle of this booklet.

I wish you an engaging read and am delighted that you are on board! Only through your support and donations were we able to assist numerous individuals in the year 2022.

Our organization at a GLANCE



The Austrian-based aid organization SONNE-International supports disadvantaged children and young people through its own education and health projects and offers innovative accompanying measures to the respective village communities.

The focus countries are Ethiopia, Bangladesh, India and Myanmar. Since 2005 we have been carrying **the Austrian Donation Seal of Approval**, and the **tax deductibility** of donations has been given since 2009.

MORE THAN A QUARTER OF A BIL-LION CHILDREN ARE UNABLE TO GO TO SCHOOL

According to UNESCO estimates, around 260 million children worldwide have no access to education, and global equal opportunities are unfortunately still a long way off. The education goal of the Global Sustainable Development Agenda is: "By 2030, ensure inclusive, equitable and high-quality education for all and promote opportunities for lifelong learning." We are firmly committed to this goal. With our extensive support programmes, we actively contribute to achieving SDG 1 (No Poverty), SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 4 (Quality Education) and SDG 5 (Gender Equality).



EDUCATION IS A HUMAN RIGHT, HEALTH CARE IS THE BASIS OF LIFE AND INNOVATION IS OUR FOCUS

Only through education can children free themselves from the poverty trap in the long term and thus lead a self-determined life in dignity. That is why, among other things, we operate 25 SONNE support facilities for more than 2500 children in order to contribute to the achievement of the development goals of the Global Sustainable Development Agenda. However, since only healthy children can develop well and actively participate in lessons, we supplement our educational projects with measures in the health sector as well as innovative accompanying measures (e.g. in the field of environmental protection).

Worldwide, more than 2000 children have the opportunity to go to school thanks to our help

As an Austrian aid organization, we pursue the goal of giving marginalized children in remote villages free access to modern educational institutions. Through our state-approved SONNE schools and educational institutions, not only do our SONNE students have the chance to escape the poverty trap, but the educational level of entire village communities is gradually raised.

SONNE-INTERNATIONAL OPERATES 25 EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS OF ITS OWN FOR 2500 STUDENTS WORLDWIDE

My name is Sonali Kumari and I am from the Indian village of Bakraur. I am the first girl in my family who will soon have a proper school leaving certificate. My family is very proud of me and we are very grateful to SONNE-International. The SONNE team convinced my parents that education was important to me and offered me a free school place. I hope that my little brother will soon be able to go to the SONNE school, too, because here we learn a lot and it's really fun. I also enjoy attending the weekly self-defence course and hope that one day I will become a strong woman and find a good job.

In order to enable children like Sonali to attend school, SONNE-International has been operating educational institutions in Bangladesh, Myanmar and India since 2002.

Through our mobile health stations are given access to medical care

Only healthy children can develop well and attend school regularly. In 2015, the United Nations committed itself to promoting "health and well-being for all" with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Since 2002, we at SONNE-International have been pursuing the goal of providing marginalized children in developing countries with free access to barrier-free basic medical care. Our health projects in Ethiopia, India, Myanmar and Bangladesh step in where help is most needed.

Thanks to our accompanying health measures, people in refugee camps in Myanmar and Bangladesh, where adequate care is often not guaranteed, have access to medical support whenever they need it.

And since only healthy children can learn successfully, all our educational projects are complemented by measures in the health sector as well. In this way, we provide children and their families with basic medical care and, in the event of serious illnesses or emergencies, treatment in a hospital.

Every human being deserves a life of dignity. Therefore, in addition to education and health, individual accompanying measures for the holistic, needs-oriented promotion of communities are of great importance to us. Through innovations, we also support our target groups in the area of environmental protection. Only together with the countries of the Global South can we tackle climate change!

NEEDS-BASED ACCOMPANYING MEASURES HELP YOUNG PEOPLE TO EARN THEIR OWN INCOME AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE FIGHT AGAINST CLIMATE CHANGE

Our ongoing accompanying measures are as different and varied as the

needs of our protégés. For example, we organize campaigns against female genital mutilation (FGM) in Ethiopia and self-defence courses for girls and women in India and Bangladesh. In addition, we enable young people to learn new skills through training programmes so that they can generate their own income.

In our education projects we have decided to put more and more emphasis on environmental education because we firmly believe that education is the most powerful tool to combat climate change. In order to train our protégés theoretically and practically to become climate savers, we have started integrating environmental workshops into our lessons.

WITH THEIR BACKS TO THE WALL FOR SO MANY YEARS

Since 2005, SONNE-International, together with its proven partner organization APDA (Afar Pastoralist Development Association), has been striving to enable the predominantly semi-nomadic pastoral people of the Afar to survive under increasingly

difficult environmental conditions (ever longer periods of drought, desertification of the last grazing areas).

The focus of our work is on **education** and **training**, **health**, and a **life of dignity**. Particularly noteworthy here are **our commitment against FGM** (female genital mutilation) as well as our training programmes for women! However, especially recently, crisis-related emergency aid (drinking water treatment, supplementary food etc.) often had to be provided.



In order to secure the basic needs of the population, we have initiated or supported sustainable projects for water supply (wells, water reservoirs), restocking of livestock herds, literacy and further education projects (student homes), etc. over the years.

SETBACKS AND PROGRESS

The civil war between the government and the rebels from the TPLF (Tigray People's Liberation Front) swept large parts of the Afar region in 2022. This led to cruel clashes, systematic destruction of vital infrastructure and dramatically rising (food) prices.

The bloody conflict has calmed down (at least temporarily), but all other problems (such as chronic food shortage, loss of livelihoods) remain unsolved. We are trying our utmost to provide the Afar pastoralists with sustainable ways out of the permanent crisis.

Our literacy and education project **"School under the Tree"**, which had to be suspended at short notice due to Corona and the civil war is expected to **resume in 2023**.

War, drought and malnutrition

Our mobile medical team defies all difficulties! Our particular concern are pregnant women, young mothers, babies and young children.

SO MUCH DESTRUCTION AND SO MUCH SUFFERING

The civil war made the work of our 80 mobile health workers, 200 TBAs (traditional birth assistants) and 8 midwives enormously difficult: Many people fled from the fighting to remote and hard-to-reach areas, most of our ambulances were either destroyed or used for military purposes, many trips in the project area were life-threatening, etc.

OUR MEDICAL STAFF IS PART OF THE COMMUNITY AND THEREFORE PAR-TICULARLY COMMITTED

Despite all these problems, we were able to maintain **basic medical care for more than 150,000 people**. Our selfless and dedicated health personnel spared no effort or danger to help: births were cared for, high-risk pregnancies were taken to an observation station and, if necessary, transferred to a hospital, children were vaccinated, supplementary

food, water purifiers and soaps were distributed, etc.



Since 2020, we have been able to extend our proven concept of mobile health care, which has been successfully used in the districts of Gewa'ane, Gela'alu and Uwwa for 15 years, to another large district in the north of the Afar region (*Eli Da'ar*).

BRINGING ABOUT LONG-TERM BEHAVIOURAL CHANGE

Awareness-raising measures were not neglected in 2022 either: In addition to counselling on nutrition and hygiene, our campaign against FGM (female genital mutilation) and other harmful practices is and remains constantly on the agenda!

Getting water every day is probably the biggest challenge for most families

A CENTURIES-OLD WAY OF LIFE WILL SOON BE HISTORY

The situation of the nomadic pastoralists from the Afar tribe is becoming increasingly precarious. The droughts are getting longer and longer, grazing land and water points are hardly available.

The camel and goat herds are severely decimated, the remaining animals weakened and susceptible to disease. As a result, most Afar have to live with constant food insecurity, and especially their children suffer from chronic malnutrition.

In addition, the civil war that has just ended has further exacerbated the supply problems and driven food prices to astronomical heights. The situation of these people has never been as dramatic as in 2022!

A RADICAL NEW APPROACH TO IMPROVING FOOD SECURITY

A master plan to put food security in the Afar region on a new footing has been developed by our partner organisation APDA (Afar Pastoralist Development Association) and renowned Ethiopian scientists and university institutions. Our Africa consultant Stefan "Stippe" Bartusch and our external expert Ulla Sever were significantly involved.

WOMEN WILL DRIVE CHANGE

In this project, financed by the **Austrian Development Agency (ADA)**, a total of 360 women and 120 young people as well as 240 volunteers from urban areas will be trained as agricultural experts in a newly renovated training centre (including 6 hectares of garden area) in Ududayto.

Then they will be provided with the necessary equipment and seeds and sent back to their villages. There they will engage in agriculture and horticulture, take care of the marketing of the products and act as multipliers.

The first 60 experts have already completed their training. If the pilot project brings the hoped-for success, it will be further expanded.



Erfried Malle's most oppressive project trip

In spring 2022, SONNE chairman Erfried Malle travelled back to Ethiopia after a two-year break due to the Corona pandemic. He was deeply shocked by the situation he found there.

NORMAL DEVELOPMENT IS DENIED TO THE AFAR CHILDREN

From our project partner Valerie Browning, Malle learned that the project region is suffering from an unprecedented drought and famine and that more than 50% of the children are chronically malnourished. This has the fatal effect that they will be permanently impaired in their physical and mental development.

NO WATER WITHOUT GOATS

He was particularly saddened by his conversations with the local people: "Countless villagers told me the same thing: The village community has to finance the drinking water (which is delivered by tankers) by selling their goats. Never before in the last 17 years have I seen so few goats in the villages and with individual families. Almost all the goats, whose milk is the basis of food for all babies and children, have apparently already fallen victim to the war and the need for drinking water."



WILLFUL DESTRUCTION OF LIVELIHOODS

The rebels of the Tigray Liberation Front destroyed ambulances, smashed medical equipment and set fire to X-ray and ultrasound machines... Goats, camels and cows were shot, wells collapsed, etc.



AND YET!

When asked about the meaningfulness of decades of humanitarian commitment in the face of such catastrophic conditions, SONNE chairman Malle answered as follows: "It is our mission to help people in their most serious needs. Development must not be halted by humanitarian setbacks!"

HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

In 2002, in the *Chittagong Hill Tracts* in the border region with Myanmar, SONNE chairman Erfried Malle went to great lengths to convince the backward members of various minority peoples, who were severely neglected by the Bangladeshi government, that the only way to escape their total impoverishment in the long term was through education. His efforts led to the construction of makeshift schools made of bamboo and corrugated iron in 10 remote mountain villages. Since then, many thousands of children have been taught there, most of whom would probably have remained illiterate for the rest of their lives without our support.

A SUCCESS STORY

Thanks to the support of our sponsor **RED CHAIRity** and many private donors as well as the tireless efforts of the SONNE employees on site and in

Austria, these simple bamboo huts have now become a total of 19 model schools (17 primary and 2 secondary schools), in which 1300 happy, welldressed children are currently well cared for and expertly taught. Approximately 40 particularly gifted young students receive special support as part of the SONNE sponsorship programme, ideally up to a university degree. Computer, tailoring and weaving courses, income-generating initiatives and medical care for tens of thousands of people are now also part of our activities. More than 100 people have found permanent employment at SONNE-International Bangladesh.

SOMETHING TO BE PROUD OF!

Where SONNE schools have been built, the villages as a whole have developed positively and the people have gained new hope. This is how we imagine sustainable development aid! We hope to be able to hand over our smoothly functioning and extremely popular schools to the Bangladeshi government soon.

UNDISTURBED OPERATION IN ALL SONNE SCHOOLS

In 2022, our 17 primary and 2 secondary schools were open continuously. Despite great political tensions in the minority areas, operations continued undisturbed. Almost without exception, our students achieved good results in the state examinations. After the Corona-related interruptions of the last few years, the children's motivation was great. They know that a good education allows them to shape their lives in a self-determined way and to escape the oppressive poverty of their families of origin! Therefore, to our relief, the vast majority of them decided to continue their education (a total of about 1300 students), although some parents had to be persuaded first!

A NEW SCHOOL FOR JHENAIGATI

Thanks to the support of a Dutch SONNE friend (who wishes to remain anonymous), we were able to open a new school building for the secondary school in the Jhenaigati district in



October 2022. Courses are already being held in the newly opened computer room. As a result, we now operate **three computer training centres and three training workshops (2 tailor workshops, 1 weaving workshop)** in Bangladesh, where we provide young people with knowledge that they can use to generate income.

OUR NEW PILOT PROJECT: LIVESTOCK BREEDING TO GEN-ERATE INCOME AND TO SE-CURE THE OPERATION OF OUR SCHOOLS

28 calves and 10 young goats were purchased by SONNE-Bangladesh and given to 17 selected families in the village of Chapachora. The animals are to be cared for and fed by them for a year in order to then achieve a much higher resale value. The profit is intended a) to create an additional income for the families concerned and b) to contribute to the operation and maintenance of the local SONNE village school.

If the scheme proves successful, we will extend it to other school locations in the future! 17 primary schools and 2 secondary schools in remote minority villages give approximately 1300 children access to valuable education

Thanks to their sponsor parents we are able to provide them with free accommodation, care and meals in the SONNE student dormitories (in Alikadam, Jhenaigati and Dhaka). Ideally, they continue their education until they graduate from university. Despite Corona-related delays, the first two students already have their bachelor's degree in their pockets and five of them will probably complete their master's degree in 2023!

These young people come from the poorest backgrounds. Their academic successes make them bearers of hope and role models in their community. Many of them want to work for their respective ethnic group later as teachers, lawyers, doctors, etc. Positive effects on the entire region can be expected!

Girls are allowed to defend themselves! Karate classes give Bengali girls strength and confidence



Since the self-defence and karate courses for our Indian SONNE students have

proved extremely popular and successful, we now also offer them at our schools in Bangladesh.

Since the beginning of 2021, qualified karate trainers have been teaching 127 girls once a week how to defend themselves against sexual assaults. The training has a positive effect on their fitness and self-confidence – and the girls are enthusiastic about it! The defense techniques learned will certainly be very helpful to them in a male-dominated society.

Limited resources, but great commitment Medical support for Rohingya refugees


In 2017, hundreds of thousands of Muslim Rohingya were brutally expelled from Buddhist-majority Myanmar by the military. Most of them have found refuge in the world's largest refugee camp in Kutupalong, Bangladesh.

Since its inception, SONNE-International has operated an infirmary within the camp, where **more than 35,000 treatments were carried out in 2022**. In addition, a further 26,000 treatments were carried out in a mobile health camp at six different locations outside the refugee camp.



In addition to the various health problems, which are often due to the catastrophic living conditions (severe overcrowding of the camp, serious environmental destruction, inadequate drinking water supply, etc.), there is also the mental suffering of the often severely traumatized people. Our two medical teams are small (only two doctors and a few assistants each) and achieve extraordinary results under difficult conditions! We are happy to be able to rely on such committed employees. In 2021, an evaluation carried out by the German **Else Kröner-Fresenius Foundation** (which is largely funding this project) attested to our "particularly efficient and cost-saving approach".

About 100,000 refugees have been resettled by the government on the island of Bhasan Char. We also supported



them there, for example by distributing aid packages.

For the 1.4 million people who remain in the camp, the situation remains bleak. There are lots of conflicts among the frustrated and hopeless people, several other problematic developments such as petty crime and gang formation are on the increase etc.

2012 - Amin Mösinger and our new project partners

In 1999, the Austrian urologist Dr. Fridolin Stögermayer launched a small school project in Bakrour in the Indian state of Bihar, one of the poorest regions of India, to enable **children from the lowest caste** to receive schooling for the first time.

In 2012, SONNE-International took over the project and, together with a local organization, now runs **three schools for about 320 students** who would not have access to education without support. One of them also houses **six orphans**.

Since 2014, we have been offering weekly self-defence courses for about 100 young girls. In 2015, karate world champion Alisa Buchinger trained the girls on site for the first time. In addition, another seven Austrians have already volunteered for SONNE-International in India for a longer period of time. Since 2016, an Indian SONNE employee has been supervising our projects together with our local partner organization as project coordinator, and in 2021 our own local organization Sun Social Organization was founded. Since 2018, we have been implementing accompanying measures in the health sector. In 2020, the SONNE schools were digitized and equipped with a photovoltaic system. In 2022, we launched our first pilot project in the field of digital environmental education and started offering **training** opportunities for women (tailoring).

Our goal remains to support the marginalized villagers in their holistic development through education and health projects.

Innovative environmental education in our Indian SONNE schools

Since 2012, we have been running an extensive education project for 320 students of the lowest caste in Bihar, India's poorest state.

As climate change has so far only been a marginal topic in the state curriculum, we have now given environmental education an important place in the curricula of our SONNE schools.



OUR "ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION ACADEMY" PURSUES AN INNOVATIVE APPROACH

In order to convey urgently needed environmental awareness to the next generation, Armin Mösinger, project manager for India and graduate human ecologist, has developed an *"Environmental Education Academy"* for primary schools together with Indian scientists and two Indian partner organizations.



The interactive programme consists of **12 webinars and hands-on exercises for students and teachers**, in which students are taught live by Indian scientists living in another state. The new online format, which has been running since February 2022 in our SONNE schools in North India and in a new partner school in South India, has been extremely well received and raises awareness of environmental issues among both students and teachers.

Causal connections are explained and ways in which every individual can contribute to climate protection are taught by recognized experts. The participating schools will be converted to so-called "green schools" by teachers and students working together to develop an environmental concept for their own school. The pilot project is constantly being evaluated and improved and will be offered to many more partner schools in the future.

WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT Two SONNE projects make the difference





Our karate self-defence courses break down gender roles

SEXUAL ASSAULT POSES A MAJOR THREAT TO INDIAN GIRLS AND WOMEN.

Therefore, since 2014, we have been offering regular self-defence courses (3 times a week) for about 100 young girls at our SONNE schools in India to prepare them preventively against violent attacks. In addition, their role within society is strengthened.

The courses are extremely popular with the girls. In a nationwide competition organized by the Indian karate association, our students were able to conquer 10 medals and thus become overall winners!

Alisa Buchinger, Karate World Champion (2016) from Salzburg, Austria, and

77 women completed a tailoring apprenticeship with us in 2022

IN THE VILLAGE OF BASADHI, WHERE WE RUN A SONNE PRIMARY SCHOOL, THERE HAVE BEEN NO TRAINING AND FURTHER EDUCATION OPPORTUNI-TIES UNTIL NOW.

Many women would like to earn money themselves in order to be less dependent on their husbands and also so that families do not have to rely on additional income from their children. At the end of 2021, our new SONNE training centre was built and the sewing machines were delivered. The training programme started at the beginning of March 2022 and by the end of the year, 77 women completed a solid and tuition-free tailoring training.

In the long term, the project will significantly improve the role of women



within the village community. When girls see that their mothers generate and manage their own income, they too will be motivated to learn a profession after graduating from primary school so that they can take on responsibility for their own lives.

Working together to help sick people in India

Medical care must not be an unaffordable luxury for anyone. That is why we complement our educational programmes in India with measures in the health sector. From November 2022 to the end of March 2023, we received valuable volunteer support from doctor John Patzer and his wife Esther Unterweger.

OUR CONTRIBUTION WAS MUCH-NEEDED AND REALLY APPRE-CIATED ... A REPORT BY ESTHER AND JOHN

On November 3, 2022, we landed in Gaya, Bihar, India. After a friendly welcome and a short settling-in period, we visited the three schools of *Buddha Educational Foundation* and SONNE-International to establish trust between the students and us. The Feast of the Child in Bakraur was a great introduction to the colourful rituals and celebrations on site!



We focused on two main areas, namely health and the environment. One of our first measures was to conduct a **medical check** on all the Indian SONNE students in order to determine their health status.

The lively participation in the **first aid workshops** and **menstrual workshops** which we held in English and Hindi in December once again proved the importance of education, prevention and community outreach. At the end of October, SONNE-International began the **construction of a clinic** in Basadhi (the only medical facility within a radius of many kilometers). As an accompanying measure, we conducted a **health assessment** for the area. This will give SONNE a better insight into how to provide efficient medical support to the people here.

For some time now, the students have been learning a lot about environmental and climate protection measures in class. **Sustainability has been integrated into the curriculum of the SONNE schools** in order to actively turn them into so-called *Green Schools*.

To support this, we started planning a **school garden** in Bakraur in December 2022. It will include vegetables, herbs and medicinal plants and will not only bring joy to the students, but also teach them how to grow food and how to use medicinal plants.

We were able to gain wonderful experiences and impressions during these 5 months and are grateful to have met so many friendly and committed people.

Since 2008, SONNE-International has been carrying out street children, educational, health and sports projects in Myanmar, since 2015 through our sister organization SONNE Social Organization. Our goal is to support as many children as possible in our day care centers. Over the years, we have been able to **integrate hundreds of children** from the slums **into a public school** and thus give them access to formal education.

In order to provide medical support, we have carried out **thousands of examinations and treatments** with our mobile medical team. In the case of serious illnesses, treatments in a hospital have been organized and paid for.

In 2019, we were able to set up our own support center, where an extensive educational program is now being implemented. Our office is also located in this SONNE building.

SONNE Social Organization Myanmar has now developed into an independent organization with a dedicated and professional team.

The last few years have been extremely difficult. Due to the effects of the pandemic and the political upheaval in February 2021, food prices have risen rapidly and many people have lost their

jobs. In the slums, there is little access to health facilities and many children have to work instead of going to

school. In 2022, we had to **help hundreds of families by distributing food parcels.**

With great commitment and flexibility, our local team has managed to continue to implement all ongoing projects so that more than **200 children and young people receive good care every day.**

- Expansion of our permanent emergency fund for the distribution of aid and hygiene packages and the unbureaucratic treatment of medical emergencies
- Additional tailoring and computer courses
- Extending our activities to IDP refugee camps
- Continuation of all ongoing projects

Gathering knowledge instead of garbage Our projects in Yangon give hope in a difficult time

Although the situation in Myanmar is very unstable, we continue to provide access to education and health care for street children and children from the slums.

Many children and adolescents in Yangon work as garbage collectors or at the market - they often see a school only from the outside. Since 2015, we have been running three day care centres in the poorest neighbourhoods, where around **120 street children receive** education, medical care and meals every day and are prepared for integration into a public school.

SCHOOL INTEGRATION AND FREE TUITION

Many children cannot go to school because they do not have a birth certificate or their parents cannot pay for school supplies. Thanks to our support, **49 children were integrated into a public school** in 2022.



In our day care centers, we offer **free tuition for over 130 children every day**. Without this support, many students would fail and drop out of school early.

OUR MOBILE DOCTOR'S SURGERY IS OFTEN THE ONLY OPTION FOR TREAT-MENT

In 2022, more than 1000 people were examined and cared for in our health camps, which take place regularly at several locations, and our team also organized the treatment of 66 patients in a hospital. Thanks to our sponsors and donors, we have been able to expand our scope of action to include refugee camps (IDP camps).



UNBUREAUCRATIC EMERGENCY RE-LIEF IN MYANMAR

As the situation in Myanmar was chaotic in 2022 (Covid-19, the long-term effects of the coup and extremely rising food prices), the projects had to be constantly adapted to the needs of the people. Since the poorest sections of the population often have no access to medical care, we reactivated the SONNE emergency fund in order to be able to help quickly and unbureaucratically. Moreover, we supported over 1300 people in the slum areas by distributing aid packages in 2022.

Since 2019 we have been running our own SONNE support centre for children from the surrounding slum area. Our local organization also has its office there. This institution is a place full of joy and knowledge. Every day, more than 200 children and adolescents are supported in our support centre through our diversified programme.

IN TWO DAY CARE CLASSES, MORE THAN 50 CHILDREN ARE CARED FOR DAILY BY OUR SOCIAL WORKERS

Children from the slums who have no other access to education are offered an extensive non-formal educational programme free of charge, as well as two hot meals a day and hygienic care. School-ready children are prepared for school integration, and the older ones are placed in an apprenticeship.



WITH SONNE TO A REGULAR SCHOOL LEAVING CERTIFICATE – THANKS TO TUTORING IN THE SUPPORT CENTRE

Many pupils at public schools do not pass the exams, and the drop-out rate for children from poorer backgrounds is significantly higher than average. This is counteracted in our support centre by daily free tutoring for up to 40 children.

279 GRADUATES - OUR TAILORING AND COMPUTER COURSES HELP PEOPLE TO EARN THEIR OWN INCOME

Income-generating vocational training is always a sustainable investment, especially in the slums. Learning manual skills and entering the local labour market ensures social integration. That is why we offer tailoring training and

computer courses for young people free of charge in our support centre. All participants receive an official certificate of their newly learned skills.

In 2022, 153 participants successfully completed the computer course. 126 young women completed the tailoring training.

DEAR FRIENDS AND SUPPORTERS OF SONNE!


My name is Jochen Meissner, originally from Traun/Upper Austria. I have been living in Myanmar since 2012 and have been closely associated with SONNE here since 2017.

In 2019 I cycled 3000 kilometers from Yangon to Singapore with 2 friends to collect donations for our new support centre, and since 2021 I have been working officially as a project coordinator for SONNE here in Yangon. [...]

In the slums of South Dagon in the east of Yangon, where our students come from, people have no access to health care. Toddlers often die from easily curable diseases like diarrhea, and the distress and despair are often very great.

People live in sheds made of bamboo poles and plastic or old cardboard, without electricity, without running water, without sewerage, it is unimaginable.

We come here regularly with our *"mobile health camps"*, where a doctor examines and treats people free of

One of my highlights this year was the construction of a kindergarten made entirely of bamboo in the Khumi Su refugee camp in September and two months later a dormitory for a children's home for up to 40 children from the war zones in the neighboring Bethala Camp [...] At the small opening ceremony with traditional music and dance, not a dry eye was left, especially mine! Although I am almost 2 meters tall and weigh 100 kilos, I am a pretty soft-hearted guy. I see the suffering, but then I do everything in my power and use all my contacts in order to help wherever help is needed. I know how privileged I am and I am infinitely grateful that by working with SONNE I have the opportunity to help those who are less fortunate than me ...




